



Southern England, south Wales and northern Scotland will see the best brightness. Very windy in the south and west. Coastal severe gales.
		Tonight: The wet and windy weather will ease overnight. Remaining rather cloudy with patchy rain across eastern Scotland, central and eastern parts of England. Clearer spells and patchy frost further west.
