



Latest forecast (Summary)	Met Office SEPA Natural Resources Wales	Today: Rain will affect many southern and central areas, heavy in places and perhaps causing some disruption. Southern England will be mild but feeling chilly elsewhere as winds strengthen. The north will be brighter and colder, with the odd shower.  Tonight: Rain will clear southeastwards, leaving many areas with clear spells but a few wintry showers affecting northern Scotland and some western and eastern coastal areas. Windy, cold, frost in places.
