



The heaviest showers will be over eastern England and over hills in the north showers will be wintry. Fine elsewhere. Windy and feeling cold.  Tonight: Most areas cold and frosty with clear periods. Showers will continue to affect parts of eastern England, showers wintry on hills. Also a few showers over Cornwall and west Wales.
