



Latest forecast (Summary)	Met Office SEPA Natural Resources Wales	Today: A spell of very windy weather moving across England and Wales this morning, along with frequent heavy showers, followed by sunny spells and further showers, these falling as rain and hail with snow over northern hills.  Tonight: Remaining windy with clear spells and showers most frequent in the west, heavy at times with hail and risk of thunder. Showers falling as snow over high ground, particularly Scotland.
