P&C Procurement Process Map

How to use/understand the process map:

- There are 6 swim lanes for the different parties: ESO, DNO/DSO, tendering party (to be decided who this is ESO/DNO/DSO/3rd party), anchor generators, top-up services, and Ofgem/Govt. Each has a colour for ease of using and understanding the process map:
 - Ofgem/BEIS/Local Govt = purple
 - ESO = orange
 - O DNO/DSO = yellow
 - Tendering party = red
 - Anchor generator = blue
 - Top-up services = green
- There are 6 stages: national strategy, regional strategy, pre-event, procurement event, construction and commercial operations
- There is also a swim lane for the timeline, which accompanies the process swim lanes
 - In the timeline swim lane; the orange, green and blue boxes are suggested/proposed time lengths for different activities to be undertaken
 - Orange boxes apply for the whole process including all parties, blue applies to the anchor generator process and green applies to the top-up services process
