# What is the impact of this change?

# When will this change take place?

### Implementation date

9 March 2022.

### Date decision required by

Panel Self-Governance vote needs to take place by 26 January 2022.

### Implementation approach

No systems or processes will need to be amended as a result of this proposal.

# Proposer's justification for governance route

Governance route: Self-Governance modification to proceed to Code Administrator Consultation

### As this modification:

- Is only making minor administrative changes to the code, so an Industry Consultation should be sufficient. We considered Fast-Track Self-Governance but believe it is more appropriate to include provision for an industry consultation.
- It will not impact parties; and it will not amend or impose any obligations on them.



- It does not have a material impact on any of the self-governance criteria, (including the governance and modification procedures).
- It does not cause any discrimination between CUSC parties but removes any existing bias or discrimination within the code.
- The best use of industry time is for Panel (rather than Ofgem), to make a final decision on this.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> If your modification amends any of the clauses mapped out in Exhibit Y to the CUSC, it will change the Terms & Conditions relating to Balancing Service Providers. The modification will need to follow the process set out in Article 18 of the Electricity Balancing Guideline (EBR - EU Regulation 2017/2195) - the main aspect of this is that the modification will need to be consulted on for 1 month in the Code Administrator Consultation phase. N.B. This will also satisfy the requirements of the NCER process.
