

Sunny spells and scattered showers follow for many, these mostly light in the west, but heavy in the north and east. Breezier in the south and east. Tonight: Showers easing with clear spells developing for many, allowing some mist and fog patches to form in places. Cooler than recent nights with temperatures dropping into single figures for some.
