



Showers or longer spells of rain across the south, these heavy and thundery at times. Warm for many Tonight: Evening showers across Wales and the southwest will fade. Low cloud, with drizzle in places across the northeast will expand westwards across central areas. Elsewhere, mostly dry with clear spells. A mild night for most.

Weather	Source	Probably some damage to a few buildings and structures from lightning strikes Some short term loss of power and other services is likely Delays to train services are possible Driving conditions may be affected by spray, standing water and/or hail, leading to longer journey times by car and bus Yellow warning of thunderstorms Areas affected: East Midlands East of England London & South East England North West England South West England Wales West Midlands Starts: 01:00 BST on Sat 21 SeptemberEnds: 23:59 BST on Sat 21 September Whilst some places will remain dry, thunderstorms and heavy showers could cause some disruption on Saturday in a few places. There is a small chance that homes and businesses could be flooded quickly, with damage to some buildings from floodwater, lightning strikes, hail or strong winds There is a small chance of fast flowing or deep floodwater causing danger to life Where flooding or lightning strikes occur, there is a chance of delays and some cancellations to train and bus services Spray and sudden flooding could lead to difficult driving conditions and some road closures There is a small chance that some communities become cut off by flooded roads There is a slight chance that power cuts could occur and other services to some homes and businesses could be lost
