

Latest forecast (Summary)	Met Office SEPA Natural Resources Wales	Today: Widely windy with gales, severe in the north and west. Frequent showers arriving from the northwest, heavy with hail and providing snow over hills before gradually fading later. Sunny spells in between, but feeling very cold in the strong winds. Tonight: Showers becoming confined to far eastern coasts and winds slowly moderating. Clear spells overnight for most, but cloud building in the west towards dawn. Touch of frost in sheltered spots.
