



Latest forecast (Summary)	Met Office SEPA Natural Resources Wales	Today: Wet and windy in the north, with heavy outbreaks of rain across Scotland. More settled further south, although cloudy to start, before sunny spells develop into the afternoon. Staying cloudy across western hills, with persistent patchy drizzle in places. Tonight: Widely cloudy with rain sinking slowly southwards across Scotland, falling as snow across the higher ground. Patchy rain elsewhere, though feeling chilly beneath clearer skies in the far south.
